7.0 POLICY

Conflict Minerals

On August 22, 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) published regulations implementing Section 1502 of the Dodd Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act governing Conflict Minerals.

These regulations enforce disclosure and reporting obligations regarding the use of conflict minerals (gold, columbite-tantalite, cassiterite and wolframite, including their derivatives, respectively tantalum, tin and tungsten) when they are determined to be necessary to the functionality or production of a product a company manufactures or contracts to manufacture.

As a SEC registrant, Stereotaxis complies with SEC regulations requiring supply chain reporting, and reasonable due diligence with respect to the sourcing of these minerals and the products in which they are contained.

Accordingly, Stereotaxis' policy on Conflict Minerals is:

- Stereotaxis endeavors to have a Conflict Free supply chain, and is committed to sourcing products and materials from conflict-free sources;
- 2. Stereotaxis expects our suppliers to have policies and processes in place to be able to trace the source of their materials and products to ensure that any Conflict Minerals contained in products we purchase from our suppliers do not originate from conflict mines within the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and the surrounding region;

Stereotaxis will provide applicable suppliers with an industry-standard

Reasonable Country of Origin Inquiry (RCOI) survey. Suppliers will be asked to certify that they have procedures in place to demonstrate materials and products are sourced in accordance with Electronic Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC) or Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) standards, and to assure the accuracy of RCOI survey responses. Stereotaxis will perform due diligence on the survey results, and may require additional information from those same suppliers in order to determine whether or not a supplier's products or materials are indeed "Conflict Free".

Many challenges lie ahead for the industry in establishing reasonable practices to break through existing complexities and barriers to information throughout the Conflict Minerals supply chain. Working together, Stereotaxis and our suppliers can help establish traceability of Conflict Minerals that will promote the eradication of human rights abuses associated with DRC regional mining activities, and provide assurance to our customers that materials necessary to the function of our products are responsibly sourced.
